



Members wishing to register their Koolies must fill out a registration application form to be submitted to the Registrar for consideration. Acceptance of a registration is not automatic. Any available evidence to support your application must be provided with the application. At the registrars discretion, a registration may be referred to the committee for consideration. The committee's decision will be final.

Colour, eye colour or coat pattern is not a criteria in accepting that a dog is a Koolie.

There are four sections to the Stud Book. A, B, C & P

Section A:

To be eligible for registration in Section A,

- 1) both parents must be registered in Section A or B.
- 2) Dogs must be named with a registered prefix.

Section B:

To be eligible for registration in Section B,

- 1) dogs may be by unregistered parents but must be obviously Koolie. Any written or photographic evidence should be provided with the registration application.
- 2) one parent registered in section A or B but the other not registered, but obviously Koolie.
- 3) one parent registered in section A or B but the other is registered in Section C.

Note: a clear photo taken side on, **must** be supplied with all adult registration applications for Section B.

Section C:

To be eligible for registration in Section C,

- 1) dogs may show strong Koolie influence but be known to have or obviously have a parent of another related breed of working dog.
- 2) one parent registered in Section A or B and one parent of another related working breed.

Note:

A photo must be supplied with all registration applications for Section C. In the case of the registrar not being of the opinion there is enough Koolie influence in the dog the application will be referred to the president of the club for adjudication. In the event that the application is turned down by the registrar and the president, the breeder may appeal the decision to the full committee at the next meeting, either presenting the dog in question or a request in writing with a clear photo both front on and the side of the dog, for a majority vote. The decision of the committee is final.

Section P:

For dogs registered as pets only. This section is for use at the **discretion of breeders**. As a breed we have a genetic problem with deafness and blindness, sometimes a puppy arrives that is not the ideal breeding prospect but would make a good pet, working, agility or obedience dog. By registering in Section P the puppy can be sold to people who want to participate in the club and its activities but have no plans to breed from their dog. Any dog registered in Section P will not be eligible to have offspring registered from it. A registration certificate with full pedigree details will be provided. You must explain to your buyer what Section P registration means. You cannot change the section of a dog previously submitted under another section to P or threaten to, to coerce a buyer.

Dogs registered in Section B, C or P which are not going to be bred or are de-sexed can be registered with the owners surname as it prefix.

Any dogs names supplied as historical information as parents, grand parents etc. but not known to be registered dogs will be entered as ancestors in the studbook with the owners surname as prefix. ie. Jones Spot, Thompsons Jess.

Dogs can only be registered in the name of a current member of the Koolie Club of Australia.

When dogs are sold to non-members, notify the registrar by forwarding a registration application, or transfer form with the original certificate. The new owner will be sent an invitation to join the club to affect the registration, if they choose not to join the club registration will remain in the breeders control.

Registration certificates are only supplied to those people the dog is registered in the name of.



Registration Numbers will be issued on a section and state basis (where the dog is first registered) ie:

(2 = N.S.W. 3 = Vic. 4 = QLD 5 = S.A. 6 = W.A. 7 = Tas. 8 = N.T.)

000025/3A = Studbook number 000025, Victorian Code = 3, Section A

000010/5C = Studbook number 000010, South Aust. Code = 5, Section C

Membership Numbers will be issued on a state basis ie:

00016/6 = Member number 00016, West Aust. Code = 6 00105/4 = Member number 00105, Queensland Code = 4

Registered Koolies that have had an accredited full DNA profile health test done will have their registration number appended with a 'D'.

Fees: (please note new fees apply from 1 November 2019)

1. Notification of Litter: \$5.00

2. Registration of a puppy

- New owner is a current financial Member - Fee \$7
- New owner is not a current financial Member - Fee \$17 (this fee will now include membership with the Koolie Club of Australia for the new puppy owner at a discount rate of \$10).
- *Please note \$2 discount per puppy registration for litters that have been Litter Notified eg this makes the fee \$5 for current financial Members and \$15 for not current financial Members*

3. Registration of an adult

- New owner is a current financial Member \$7.00
- New owner is not a current financial Member \$27.00 (this includes membership with the Koolie Club of Australia)

4. Transfer of a Registered Dog

- New owner is a current financial Member \$7.00
- New owner is not a current financial Member \$27.00 (this includes membership with the Koolie Club of Australia)

Litter Notification:

On the birth of a litter a breeder can register the litter with the club, subsequent registration of those puppies is at a reduced rate of \$5 each. The litter is listed in the newsletter and on the Club's Facebook page. On receiving enquiries for puppies, the registrar refers them firstly to those breeders who have notified of a litter with puppies that might meet the purchasers requirements. The club does not take any part in the negotiation of a sale and does not recommend or warrant any purchase.
